REGULATIONS

of the Congress entitled: World Copernican Congress, 24-26 May 2023 (hereinafter referred to as the "Regulations")

§ 1

Date and duration of the Congress

- These Regulations define the rights and obligations of the Participants of the Congress "World Copernican Congress", hereinafter referred to as the "Congress" which will take place on 24-26 May 2023, at the Jagiellonian University in Kraków, and online via the streaming platform You Tube / JU portal, (hereinafter referred to as the "Platform").
- 2. The Congress is organized by the Jagiellonian University Centre for Communications and Marketing, (hereinafter referred to as the "Organizer"), Gołębia 24, 31-007 Kraków, Poland, acting on behalf of the Ministry of Education and Science, Wspólna Street 1/3, 00-529 Warszawa, Poland, (hereinafter referred to as the "Organizer").
- 3. The Congress is held under the patronage of the Honorary Committee (hereinafter referred to as the "Patron"), composed of:
 - 1. Witold Kozłowski Marshal of the Lesser Poland Voivodeship;
 - 2. prof. dr hab. Jacek Majchrowski Mayor of the City of Kraków;
 - 3. prof. dr hab. Jacek Popiel Rector of the Jagiellonian University;
 - 4. dr hab. Stanisław Mazur, prof. CUE Rector of the Cracow University of Economics;
 - 5. prof. dr hab. Eng. Jerzy Lis Rector of the AGH University of Science and Technology;
 - 6. prof. dr hab. Jarosław Górniak chairman of the Scientific Council of the Krakow part of the World Copernican Congress;
 - 7. Katarzyna Basiak-Gała representative of the National Bank of Poland.
- 4. Scientific supervision over the course of the Congress is provided by the Scientific Council of the Congress, appointed by the Organizer, (hereinafter referred to as the "Scientific Council").
- 5. Any person of full legal age can participate in the Congress if, by **10 May 2023** at the latest, they have stated their will to participate in the Congress in the manner referred to in § 2 of the Regulations and have accepted the rules of participation in the Congress referred to in the Regulations (hereinafter referred to as the "Participant").
- 6. The Regulations are made available to the Participants on the Congress website https://kopernik550.uj.edu.pl, (hereinafter referred to as the "Congress Website"), in Polish and English language versions, in a way that enables its downloading.
- 7. The Organizer reserves the right to change the Regulations due to changes in generally applicable laws and the need to adapt the Regulations to this change, in particular in order to adjust the formula of the Congress to the restrictions, orders and prohibitions in force during Congress related to the introduction of a pandemic, and to increase the security measures accompanying the Congress The amendment to the Regulations will come into force within 7 days of its publication on the Congress Website. With regard to Participants who accepted the Regulations before making the change, the change will enter into force within 7 days of informing them about the change in the Regulations by e-mail and not expressing objections to this change in the above-mentioned document within the given deadline.
- 8. The Organizer reserves the right to change the Regulations also in the event of a change that does not adversely affect the rights of the Participants or a change consisting in correcting

- obvious typographical errors and editorial errors. In this case, the amendment to the Regulations may enter into force within a period shorter than 7 days, but not shorter than 3 days from informing the Participants about the change to the Regulations by e-mail and not expressing objections to this change in the above-mentioned document within the given deadline.
- 9. The Organizer reserves the right to change the date and formula of the Congress in a situation where its conduct in the period and in the form referred to in sec. 1 above will be impossible or excessively difficult for reasons beyond the Organiser's control, in particular due to restrictions, orders and bans related to the introduction of a state of pandemic. Changes in the date and/or formula of the Congress will be immediately announced on the Congress Website.
- 10. The Organizer reserves the right to make changes to the Congress program, including the right to change the timetable and the order of presentations. In the event of changes, the Organizer will immediately inform about them on the Congress Website. A change in the Congress program does not constitute a change to the Regulations.

Registration of participation in the Congress

- 1. Participation in the Congress is free of charge and requires prior registration via the registration form (hereinafter referred to as the "Form") available at https://kopernik550.uj.edu.pl (hereinafter referred to as the "Registration Website"), where a person wishing to participate in the Congress will be required to provide the following data: name and surname, e-mail address, phone number, afilliation.
- 2. The details about the registration and the registration deadlines are provided on the Congress Website https://kopernik550.uj.edu.pl.
- 3. In the event of resignation from participation in the Congress, the Participant is obliged to immediately inform the Organizer by sending relevant information to: konferencje@uj.edu.pl.
- 4. Participation in the Congress may take two forms of participation (hereinafter referred to as "Forms of participation"):
 - a) online, i.e., in real time, via the Platform designated by the Organizer, with open access (hereinafter referred to as the "Online Participation" or, respectively, "Online Participant");
 - b) in person, by the Participant appearing at the Congress venue (hereinafter referred to as the "Stationary Participation" or, respectively, "Stationary Participant").
- 5. The Participant selects one of the Forms of participation in the Congress by checking the appropriate box in the Form. The Organizer is not responsible for providing incorrect or untrue data by the Participant during the registration of participation in the Congress.
- 6. A maximum of 500 Participants may participate in the Congress in the form of stationary participation.
- 7. The Limit, indicated in sec. 6 above, may change due to the epidemiological situation prevailing during the Congress and the related restrictions, orders, and bans. The Organizer will immediately notify about the change of limits on the Congress Website. If it is necessary to limit the number of Participants qualified for stationary participation, the Organizer shall, within the available limits, re-qualify the Participants referred to in sec. 4 point b) above, considering the order of their notifications. The Organizer will inform, by e-mail, the Participants who, due to the change of limits, will not be able to participate in the Congress in person. Those Participants will have the opportunity to participate in the Congress online, via the Platform.

- 8. Online participation requires the Participant to have an ICT system that meets the following minimum technical requirements:
 - a) Internet access;
 - b) terminal equipment;
 - c) software that allows reading files in various formats (including text, sound, graphics, multimedia, video, etc.);
- 9. The Participant confirms reading the Regulations and accepting the provisions of the Regulations, which is tantamount to granting by the Participant the permits, licenses and authorizations referred to in the Regulations. Registration of participation in the Congress is made at the moment of completing the Participant's data in the Form and sending it by the Participant, along with the consents referred to in § 5-8 of the Regulations, using the registration system on the Congress Website.
- 10. The Participant acquires a place to participate in the Congress and / upon receipt of confirmation of registration.

General Congress participation rules

- During the Congress, debates will be held, and lectures will be presented. The Congress will be conducted in English and Polish. Detailed information and the Congress program are available on the Congress Website
- 2. The course of the Congress, including both the online participation and the stationary participation, will be recorded as audio-video (hereinafter referred to as the "Recording"). The Organizer will make the Recording available to an unlimited circle of recipients at https://kopernik550.uj.edu.pl / You Tube platform.
- 3. The Organizer, by making congress materials (hereinafter referred to as "Congress Materials") available to Participants, draws particular attention to the obligation for the Participants to respect intellectual property rights. Participants undertake to use the Congress Materials made available to them by the Organizer only for their own personal use. Modification, copying, sending, public performance and any use of these Congress Materials for commercial purposes requires prior written consent of the Organizer or by another authorized entity. Participants are fully responsible for any damages caused as a result of their behaviour contrary to the above reservation.
- 4. Participants accept the established rules of the Congress and its program and undertake not to influence its change and not to disturb the course of the Congress. The Organizer is entitled to exclude from participation in the Congress Participants who violate the provisions of the Regulations, in particular:
 - a) disrupt the course of the Congress,
 - b) undertake actions that are against the law, decency or detrimental to the legitimate interests of third parties;
 - c) take actions aimed at circumventing or indicating an attempt to circumvent the Regulations or the rules of holding the Congress,
 - d) take actions that violate the legitimate interests of the Organizer or harm its image.
- 5. The Organizer is not responsible for:
 - a) incorrect or faulty operation of the software used by the Participant;
 - b) lack or interruptions in Internet access for reasons attributable to the Participant;
 - c) defectiveness of the computer equipment used by the Participant;

- d) incorrect use of the Platform by the Participant;
- e) other circumstances preventing or hindering participation

Rights and obligation of the stationary Participants

- 1. After arriving at the Congress venue, the stationary participant is obliged to confirm their personal participation in the Congress at the reception desk.
- 2. Stationary participants are obliged to comply with the safety rules, health and safety and fire regulations in force at the Congress venue and the rules of the sanitary regime in force at that time.
- 3. The Organizer is not responsible for items left and lost during the Congress and for items left in clothing or backpacks/handbags/suitcases delivered to the cloakroom, as well as in other public places at the Congress, and at the Jagiellonian University.
- 4. In the event of a Participant disturbing law and order and failing to comply with the rules of the sanitary regime in force during the Congress, the Congress staff is entitled to:
 - a) demand that the Participant behave appropriately;
 - b) demand that the Participant leave the Congress area,
 - c) call the appropriate services in a situation where the Participant's behaviour qualifies for such an intervention, in particular when it poses a threat to other Participants or the Congress staff or the Organizer's property.
- 5. The Organizer is not responsible for events resulting from the Participants' failure to comply with the Regulations, the Participants' failure to comply with the Organizer's recommendations and the instructions of the Congress staff and services responsible for security and order.
- 6. In order to ensure security at the Congress, the Organizer may use monitoring covering the entire area of the Congress, as well as its individual parts. The rules for the use of video surveillance by the Organizer are set out in Ordinance No. 34 of the Rector of the Jagiellonian University of May 16, 2019, on: Rules of video surveillance at the Jagiellonian University, as amended, available in the Public Information Bulletin of the Jagiellonian University.
- 7. In the event of noticing a threat to the life and health of the Participants, the Participant is obliged to immediately inform the Congress staff.

§ 5

Lectures

- 1. The Scientific Council selects the Speakers based on its own discretion and the need to ensure a high scientific level and thematic diversity of the Congress.
- 2. Delivering the Lecture, as well as granting the Organizer permissions, authorizations and licenses referred to in § 6-7 of the Regulations for the Use of the Lecture and the Speaker's image, within the scope and in all fields of use indicated therein, is free of charge and takes place for the Organizer's statutory purposes.
- 3. Granting the Organizer permissions, licenses and authorizations referred to in § 6-7 of the Regulations is voluntary, but necessary to present the Lecture.

Copyright

- 1. The Speaker bears full responsibility for the form and content of the Lecture.
- 2. The Speaker undertakes to develop and present an original Lecture and guarantees that the Lecture will not infringe the rights and personal rights of third parties, contain theses and views that incite hatred or discrimination of any people on racial, cultural, ethnic, religious, ideological, or other grounds. gender. In addition, it is unacceptable to promote ideology and symbolism related to totalitarian regimes in the Lecture, as well as to present other topics prohibited by generally applicable regulations.
- 3. If any part of the Lecture consists of legally protected elements to which the Speaker is not entitled, the Speaker guarantees that they are entitled to use them to the extent necessary to deliver the Lecture and grant the Organizer a License with the right to grant sublicenses referred to in this paragraph without the need for the Organizer to obtain additional consents and permits.
- 4. The Speaker agrees to the transmission of the Lecture in real time using live streaming of the Lecture via the Platform and to its recording by the Organizer or an entity acting on the Organizer's behalf.
- 5. The Speaker grants the Organizer a license: non-exclusive, unlimited in time and territory, quantity and quality, with the right to sublicense in the same scope as the license, to use the Lecture recorded in the form of a Recording in whole or in part, independently, as well as part of a collective work, in juxtaposition with works and elements freely selected by the Organizer (e.g. with lectures by other Speakers, with the Platform's graphic design, image and sound, including as part of the so-called Congress Materials), as well as with its studies, adaptations and all materials, graphics, fragments, shots, documentation created both during and after the completion of the Recording for information, documentation, educational, didactic purposes, advertising and promotion of the Organizer and the Congress itself, including in particular its use, sharing on the Internet, Intranet and as part of any telecommunications services using any systems and devices, on all social networking sites of the Organizer, on the Organizer's Website and on other Organizer's websites and on the Congress Website.
- 6. The license referred to in sec. 5 above (hereinafter referred to as the "Licence"), is granted to the Organizer at the moment of transmission of the Speaker's speech using live streaming and its recording in the form of a Recording and includes the use of the Lecture in the following fields of use:
 - a. recording and multiplying the Lecture producing copies of the Lecture using all available techniques, including printing, reprographic, magnetic recording, and digital technology (e.g., DVD, magneto-optical media);
 - b. permanent or temporary reproduction of the Lecture in whole or in part by any means and in any form;
 - c. in terms of broadcasting the Lecture public performance, displaying, displaying, reproducing, broadcasting and re-broadcasting, as well as making the Lecture publicly available in such a way that everyone can access it at a place and time of their choice, using all available techniques, including use on the Internet, Intranet and other computer networks, posting and modifying the Lecture on websites, in social networking sites, broadcasting the Lecture using multimedia and ICT networks, modifications of the Lecture enabling the creation of navigation on websites, making it publicly available at public exhibitions or exhibitions;

- d. in the scope of trading in the original or copies on which the Lecture was recorded introducing into circulation, lending, or renting the original or copies;
- e. creating and broadcasting derivative works of the Lecture, including further projects/materials based on the Lecture or their individual elements, including the development of different graphic, colour or visual or spatial formats of the Lecture and the use of such derivative works in the scope and in all fields specified in this paragraph;
- f. re-broadcasting, presenting in the press, on the Internet, on large format posters and in any other forms of promotion or advertising;
- 7. The license also includes the right to exercise derivative rights to the Lecture by the Organizer and persons acting on its behalf in all fields of use referred to in sec. 5-6 above, including in particular the right to make changes to the Lecture and prepare its studies, use and dispose of derivative works and the right to allow third parties to exercise derivative copyrights to the Lecture with a scope analogous to that used by the Organizer.
- 8. The Speaker authorizes the Organizer and entities to whom the Organizer grants further authorizations to exercise their moral rights to the Lecture, in particular the right to inviolability of the content and form of the Lecture and its fair use, decide on the first access to the Lecture to the public, supervise the use of and decide on the method of marking the author of the Lecture and undertakes not to exercise these rights towards the Organizer and entities authorized by him, with the proviso that the Organizer, at the request of the Speaker and as far as possible, is obliged to respect the Speaker's wish to be marked as the person presenting the Lecture.
- 9. In the event of claims by third parties against the Organizer and/or entities acting on its behalf and/or entities authorized by it to use the Lecture and (hereinafter referred to as "Authorised Entities"), claims related to the Lecture or their individual elements, Speaker:
 - a) indemnify the Organizer and/or Authorized Entities from the claims in question, to the extent to which it was obliged to acquire rights to legally protected elements of the Lecture from third parties, including copyright and related rights to them and their individual elements, and to obtain permission from them and authorizations referred to in this paragraph and
 - b) will be fully liable for any damages suffered by the Organizer and/or Authorized Entities due to the claims referred to in point a) above, including primarily, but not exclusively, for damages related to the claim for damages for unlawful use of the Lectures and/or unlawful use of their individual elements.

Image

- The Organizer will broadcast the course of the Congress via the Platform and will also record
 it using image and audio-video recording devices, respectively in the form of a photo report
 (hereinafter referred to as "Photo report") and recording for educational, didactic,
 information, documentation, advertising purposes and promotion of the Organizer and the
 Congress itself.
- 2. The stationary participant, declaring in the Form their willingness to participate in the Congress in person, expresses consent, unlimited in time, territory, quantity, and quality, to the use of their image for the purposes indicated in sec. 1 above, without the right to remuneration for the above, in particular through:

- a) transferring his image in real time for the purposes of coverage of the Congress, via the Platform, using live streaming;
- b) recording the Participant's image in the Photo Report and/or Recording and using this recording, processing, duplication and multiple dissemination of the Participant's image recorded in the above-mentioned manner without the need to approve them each time, to the extent and in a manner analogous to that referred to in § 6 sec. 5-7 of the Regulations, including in particular on the Congress Website, the Platform, on the Organizer's Websites, and on other websites, on the Organizer's social media websites and on websites, on the Organizer's promotional events.
- 3. The Speaker, providing consent to the Organizer to deliver the lecture, expresses their consent, unlimited in time, territory, quantity, and quality, to the use of his image for the purposes indicated in sec. 1 above, without the right to remuneration for the above, in particular through:
 - a) transferring his image in real time for the purposes of coverage of the Congress via the Platform, using live streaming;
 - b) recording the Speaker's image in the Photo Report and/or Recording and using this recording, processing, duplication and multiple dissemination of the Speaker's image recorded in the above-mentioned manner without the need to approve them each time, to the extent and in a manner analogous to that referred to in § 6 sec. 5-7 of the Regulations, including in particular on the Congress Website, the Platform, on the Organizer's Websites, and on other websites, on the Organizer's profiles in social media and on websites, on the Organizer's promotional events.
- 4. The Participant/Speaker is aware that the Photo Report and the Recording from the Congress will be made available on the Internet and will be available at https://kopernik550.uj.edu.pl and on the You Tube platform for an unlimited number of people without a time limit.
- 5. With regards to the use of the image, the Participant/Speaker will not exercise the right to control and approve the use of the image each time, including the right to approve the final form of the Photo Report and/or Recording in which the image was used and the right to name them each time as a person featured in Photo report and/or in the Recording, in particular, indicating the name and surname.
- 6. The Congress may be recorded (audio-video) for the purposes of the Recording and photographed in the form of the Photo Report only by the Organizer. It is forbidden for Participants to record and take photos during the Congress without the Organizer's prior consent
- 7. The Organizer has the right to authorize other entities to use the image on the terms set out in the Regulations.

Processing of personal data

In accordance with Article 13 of Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 April 2016 on the protection of individuals with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data and repealing Directive 95/46/WE (General Data Protection Regulation, hereinafter the "General Regulations"), the Organizer reports that:

1. The administrator of your personal data is the Jagiellonian University, 24 Gołębia Street, 31-007 Krakow, represented by the Rector of the Jagiellonian University.

- 2. The Jagiellonian University has appointed a Data Protection Officer, 4 Czapskich Street, 31-110 Krakow. The Officer can be contacted by email: iod@uj.edu.pl or at telephone number 0048 12 663 12 25 from Monday to Friday, from 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.
- 3. Your personal data will be processed for the purpose of:
 - a. performance of the contract the subject of which is participation in the Congress "World Copernican Congress" as well as for the purpose of registering participation in the Congress, i.e., pursuant to Art. 6 sec. 1it. b) GDPR, on the basis of an agreement concluded by accepting the Regulations. The Congress, organized on 24-26 May 2023, by the Jagiellonian University in Kraków, will be held stationary, partly online with the usage of the You Tube platform.
 - b. conducting the Photo Report, Recording and live streaming of the Congress for documentation, information, educational, didactic purposes, advertising and promotion of the Organizer, and the Congress itself, archiving - in relation to the Participants' personal data in the form of an image - on the basis of their consent, i.e., pursuant to GDPR art. 6 sec. 1 a).
- 4. Providing your personal data is necessary to conclude a contract, participate in the Congress, and deliver a Lecture. Providing personal data in the field of image is voluntary.
- 5. Your personal data may be made available to entities authorized to receive them on the basis of generally applicable law.
- 6. The recipients of your personal data are entities providing IT and organizational support in the organization of the Congress- including the entity providing software for registration for the Congress and the live streaming of the Congress.
- 7. Your personal data will not be transferred to a third country (outside the European Economic Area) neither to international organizations.
- 8. Your personal data will be stored for the duration of the organization of the Congress and until the final settlement and closing of the Congress, as well as until the claims that may arise from the performance of the contract referred to in sec. 3 a), and in the scope indicated in sec. 3 b) above until you withdraw your consent to the processing of data.
- 9. Your personal data provided in the Registration Form will not be disclosed to third parties.
- 10. Your personal data in the form of an image may be recorded on photos from the Congress used to create a Photo Report and processed on the Congress Website, Organizer's social networks and profiles and on University social media channels (in particular Facebook, YouTube, Twitter, Instagram), in a manner enabling access by third parties, for information, documentation, educational, didactic purposes, advertising and promotion of the Organizer and the Congress itself, as well as archiving, including for the purposes of reporting from the Congress in accordance with § 7 of the Regulations.
- 11. If you are a Participant who expressed a wish to deliver a lecture, personal data voluntarily indicated in the Lecture will be processed on the Congress Website for information and documentation purposes.
- 12. You have the right to: obtain information about the processing of personal data and rights in accordance with the GDPR, access and rectify your data, as well as the right to delete personal data from the administrator's files (unless further processing is necessary for the performance of legal obligation or to establish, assert or defend claims), and the right to limit processing, transfer data, object to processing in the cases and under the conditions specified in the GDPR.
- 13. To the extent that the processing takes place on the basis of consent, you also have the right to withdraw consent at any time without affecting the lawfulness of the processing which was carried out on the basis of consent before its withdrawal.

- 14. Withdrawal of consent to the processing of personal data may be sent by e-mail to the following address: konferencje@uj.edu.pl, by traditional mail to the following address: ul. Michałowskiego 9/3, 31-126 Krakow or withdrawn in person by visiting the Jagiellonian University Promotion and Communication Centre, ul. Michałowskiego 9/3, 31-126 Kraków.
- 15. Your personal data will not be subject to automatic decision making or profiling.
- 16. You have the right to lodge a complaint with the President of the Personal Data Protection Office if you consider the processing of your personal data to be in violation of the provisions of the GDPR.

Final provisions

- 1. These Regulations are made available to the Congress Participants on the Congress Website and enter into force on the day of their publication on the above-mentioned website. page.
- 2. The Organizer reserves the right to cancel the Congress The Organizer will immediately inform about the cancellation of the Congress on the Congress Website. The Organizer will not be obliged to any compensation or damages to the Participants and Speakers in this respect, or to refund the costs incurred to participate in the Event.
- 3. In matters not covered by the Regulations, generally applicable provisions of Polish law shall apply.
- 4. Any disputes will be subject to the jurisdiction of Polish common courts competent for the seat of the Organizer.
