at the University of Texas, Dallas. She holds a double-Phd from the University of Wisconsin, Madison, with a dissertation project entitled: "Poetic Resolutions of Scientific Revolutions: Astronomy and the Literary Imaginations of Donne, Swift and Hardy." At UT-Dallas, she is the Director of the

Japanese anime and manga. Her major publications include: Thomas Hardy's Novel Universe: Astronomy, Cosmology and Gender in the Post-Darwinian World (Routledge/Ashgate) and An Encyclopedia of Literature and Science (Greenwood).
