

Stefano Gulizia. A historian of early modern science and philosophy. Associate professor at the University of Milan. He taught extensively in the U.S. and held fellowships in California, Chicago, Montréal, Oxford, Berlin and Wolfenbüttel. In the past years - a fellow at the

ICUB and the NEC in Bucharest, and a resident of the Polish Academy of Sciences in Warsaw. His research expands on the dynamics of Aristotelian natural philosophy from antiquity to the seventeenth century, on humanist methods of reading, and on historical applications of network analysis related to collecting and print culture.
