



Michael (Michał) Heller, b. Born in 1936, he is a professor emeritus at the Pontifical University of John Paul II in Krakow, Poland and an associate member of the Vatican Astronomical Observatory. He is also an ordinary member of the Pontifical Academy of Sciences and an ordinary member of the Polish Academy of Art and Sciences in Krakow. He is a laureate of the prestigious Templeton Prize, as well as the founder of the Copernicus Center for Interdisciplinary Research, currently part of the Jagiellonian University in Krakow. His research areas are: relativistic physics, in particular relativistic cosmology, geometric methods in physics; natural philosophy and history of science; issues on the borderline of science and theology. He is the author of numerous scientific papers and popular science books.
